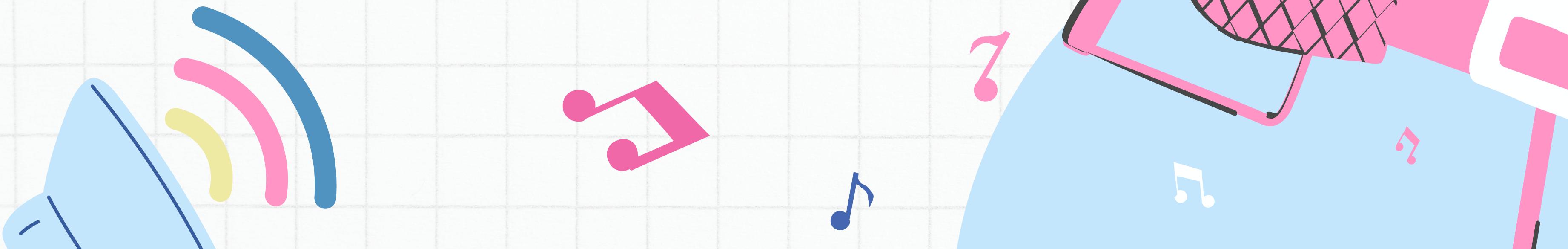
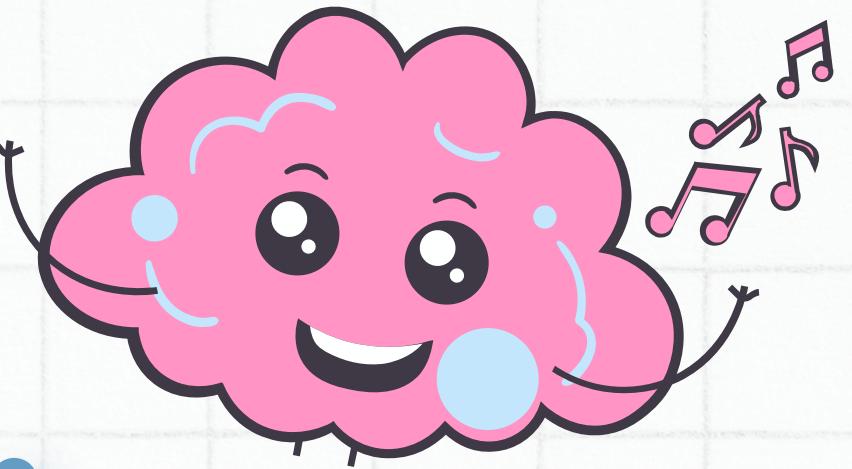


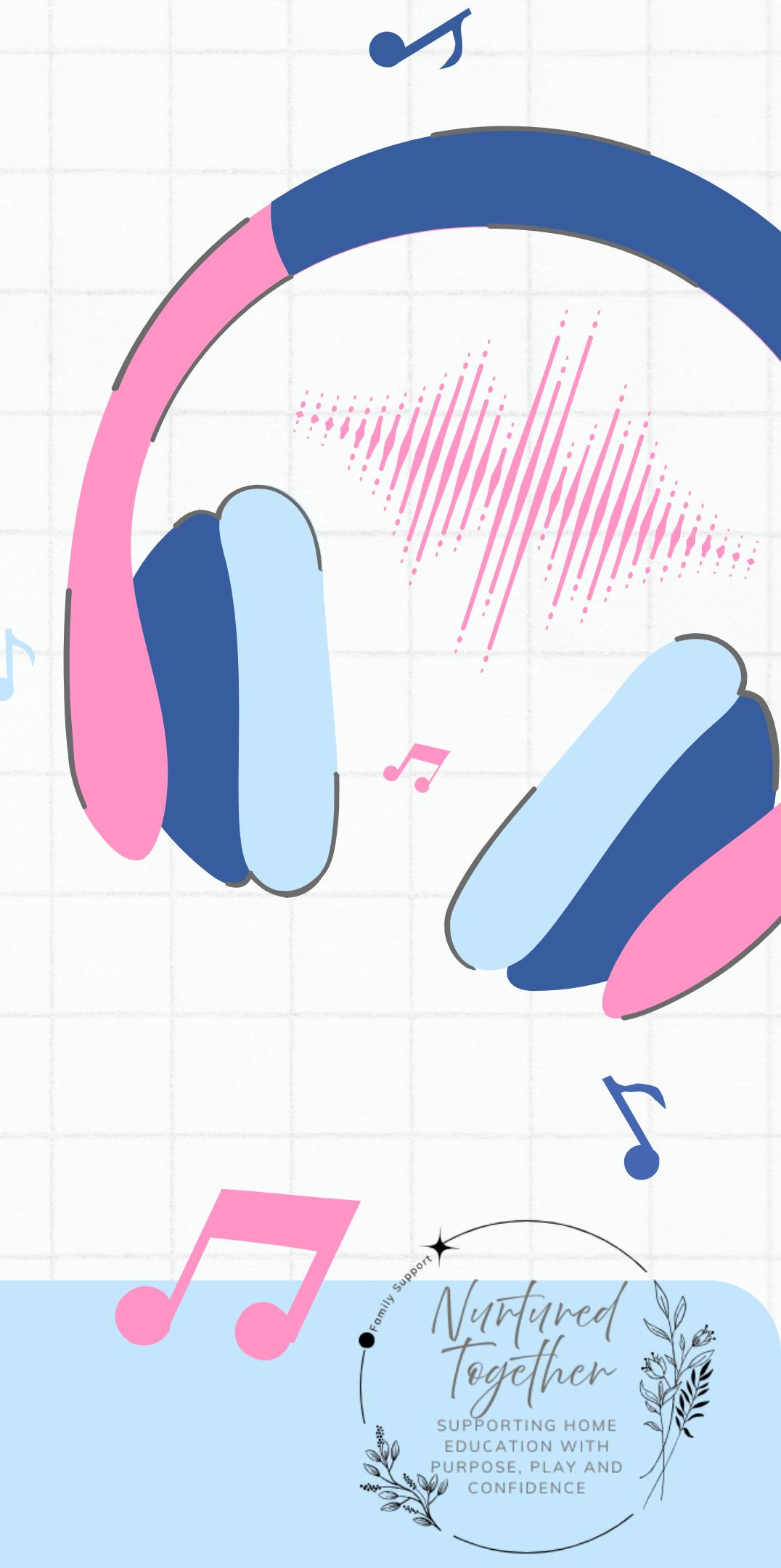
Finding Your Unique Voice

Your voice helps establish a bond with your audience.

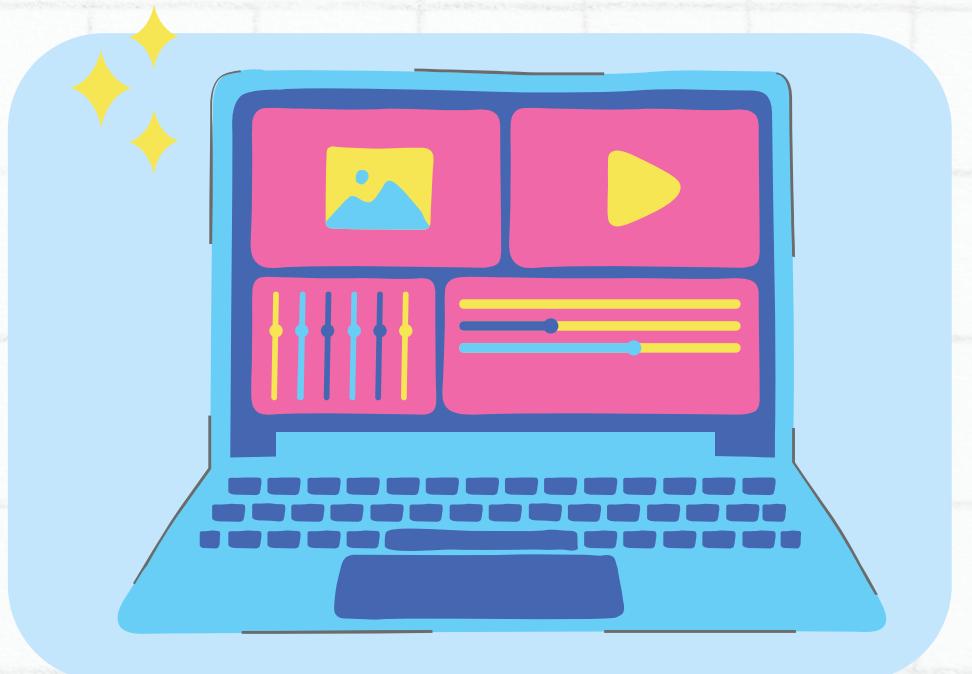


How to Start Finding Your Voice ?

Tone

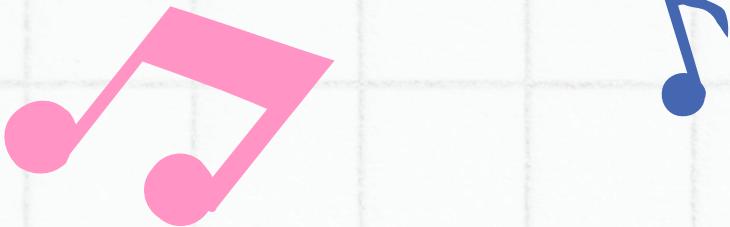
Refers to the attitude or emotion behind your words

Draw from Life

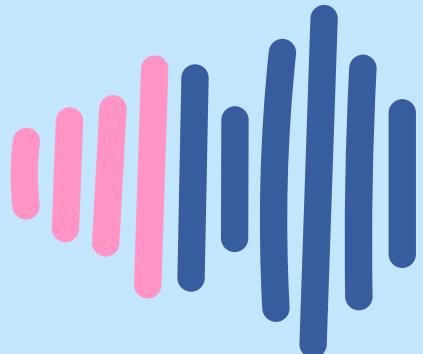
Your experiences, values, and beliefs shape your unique perspective.

You could start by writing a list of the things you want to say.

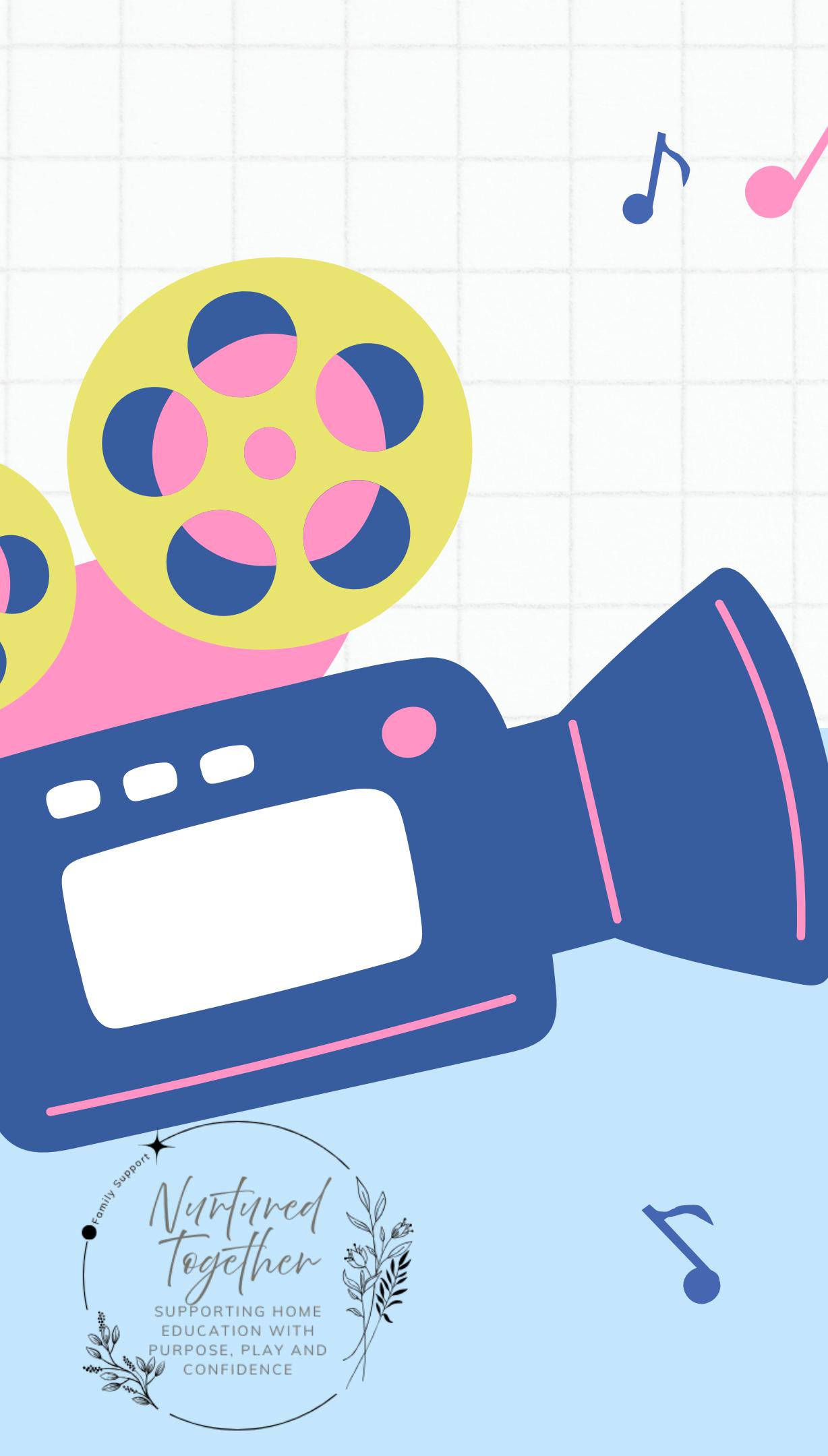
Build it up, record videos or audio, there are many ways to record your voice, because what you want to say is important!

Edit with Your Voice in Mind

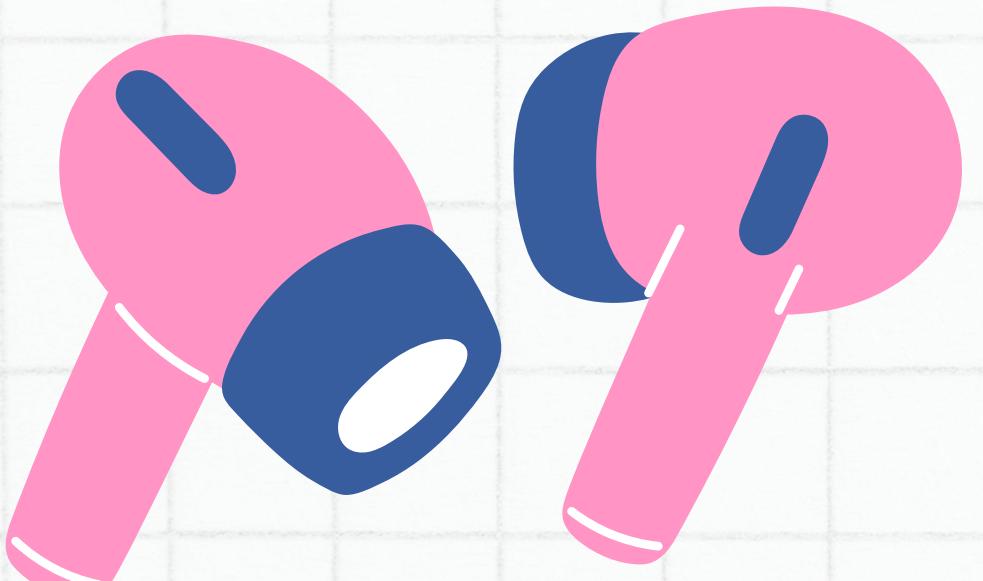

Your quirks and individual traits make your voice special.

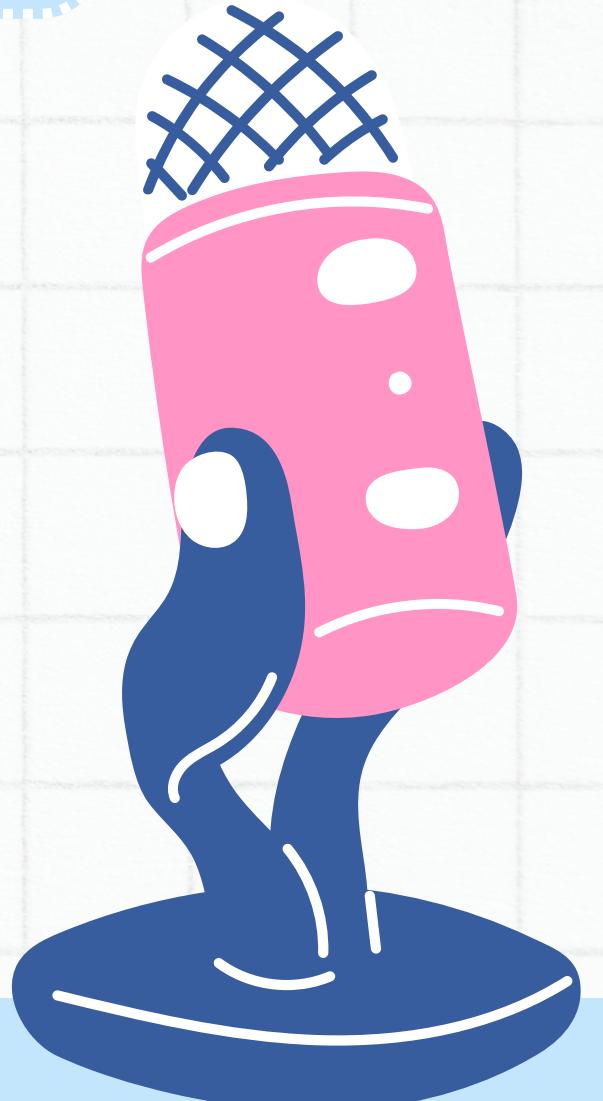


Avoid Imitation

Celebrate Your Perspective

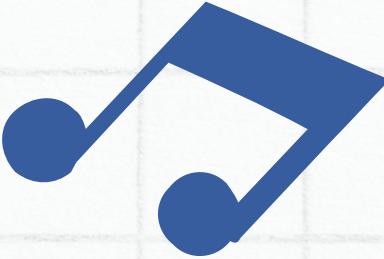
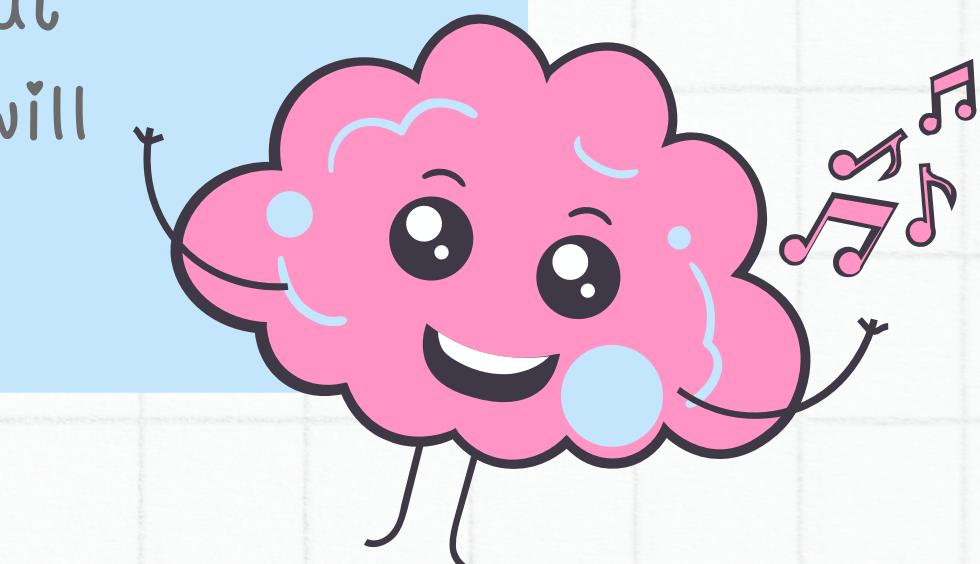
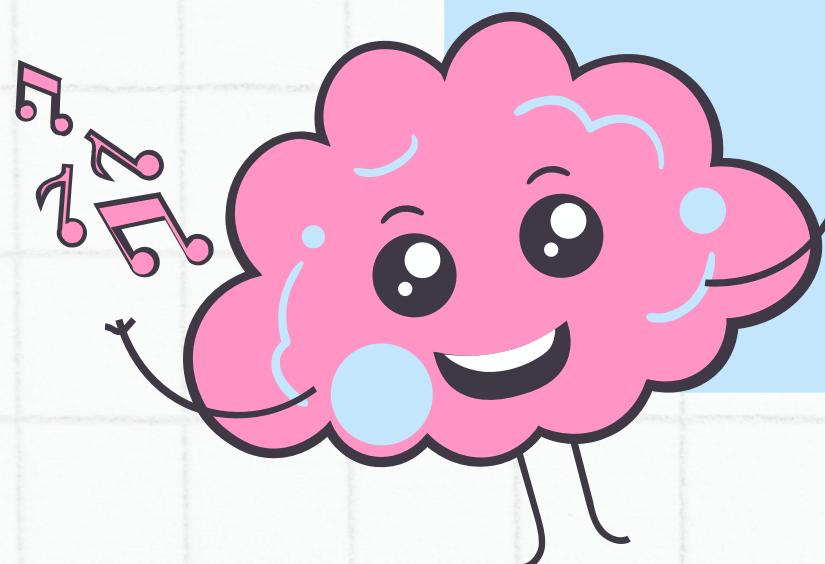
Your personal experiences, background, and values shape how you see the world.
